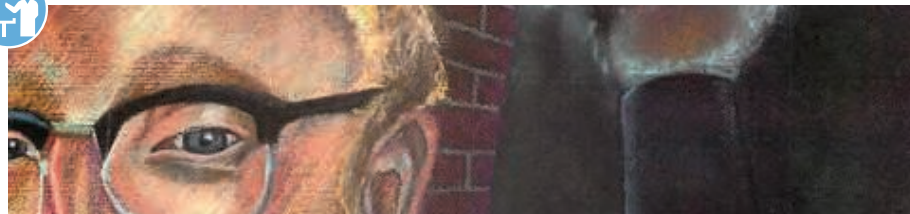

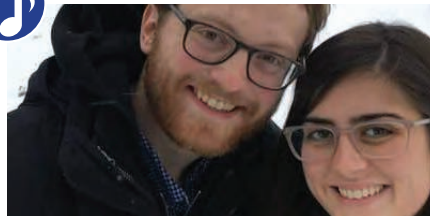

Don Accurso Orchestra

BSP favorite The Don Accurso Orchestra returns for another engaging appearance. Don has been leading a band for more than 65 years, beginning the day his military service ended. He is credited with keeping the music of the '40s alive in KC. The Don Accurso Orchestra is here thanks to a generous gift from the wonderful Kauffman Foundation.



Speaker Series | David Von Drehle

Tuesday, June 26, 3:00 p.m. | Westport Room

Resident Mary Abbott is responsible for securing a presentation from the highly-acclaimed and respected author and journalist David Von Drehle.

Von Drehle started his career in journalism at 17 years old, working with *The Denver Post* as a sports writer from 1978 to 1983, where he was the youngest sports writer ever. He moved to the *Miami Herald* in 1985 and stayed on with the paper until 1991 as a staff writer and New York Correspondent, receiving the Livingston Award in 1988 for excellence in young journalism. Von Drehle was honored for a series titled "The Death Penalty: A Failure of Execution." The piece also garnered Von Drehle the American Bar Association's Silver Gavel Award for excellence in Media and the Arts in 1989. During his tenure with the *Miami Herald*, Von Drehle also received an American Society of News Editors Distinguished Writing Award, and has subsequently been featured in ASNE's collections of America's Best Newspaper Writing.

In 1991, Von Drehle became the New York bureau chief

for *The Washington Post*. Von Drehle left *The Washington Post* in 2006 to become Editor-at-Large for *Time*, where he wrote more than 60 cover stories, including the 2008 Person of the Year (Barack Obama), a cover piece on controversial talking head Glenn Beck titled "Mad Man," coverage of the deaths of Michael Jackson and Osama bin Laden, the 2014 Person of the Year (Ebola Fighters), and a magazine-length essay on forgiveness after the murders at Emanuel A.M.E. Church in Charleston, S.C. That article won the Deadline Award for Best Magazine Feature of 2015.

Von Drehle returned to *The Washington Post* in 2017 as a twice-weekly opinion columnist. He is also a recurring contributor to NPR's *Morning Edition*.

David Von Drehle is the author of several award-winning and bestselling books, including *Among the Lowest of the Dead: Inside Death Row*; *Deadlock: The Inside Story of America's Closest Election*; *Triangle: The Fire That Changed America*; and *Rise to Greatness: Abraham Lincoln and America's Most Perilous Year*.

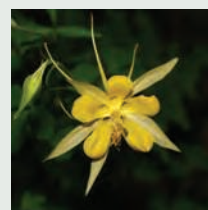
