Come to the Memorial Garden. just outside the south entrance to Windsor Care. It's time to see the first of our perennial flowers. Of particular interest may be the columbines in three different locations. Each delights passersby with a crown of tiny flowers which, from afar, resembles the flight of miniature butterflies with every gentle breeze. A second columbine variety is semi-hidden behind the concrete bench. Columbines are self-seeding and will re-bloom after allowing their seeds to begin their flight with a useful wind.

Of new interest will be some irises planted last fall next to the angel beneath the memorial plaques on the brick wall. These are a new variety; each will bloom more than once, unlike the other irises in the garden.

Our annual visitors, the voracious beetles, are soon to arrive. They especially enjoy munching on clematis flowers and leaves. Roses seem to be a second choice. At least one mature tree near the north entrance of Windsor Care was nearly eaten alive last summer with only the veins of its leaves remaining, obviously unappetizing to the visitors. The Old Farmer's 2019 Almanac recommends, as a last resort, that the adult beetles be squished or dropped into a container of soapy water.
