Barry Grissom is a candidate for the Democratic Party nomination for U.S. Senate for the state of Kansas. He served as the United States Attorney for the District of Kansas, focusing on civil rights enforcement and community outreach. He directed the District's Project Safe Neighborhood program and oversaw the District's Project Safe Childhood program. He helped lead the investigation and successful prosecution of the Wichita Airport and the Fort Riley terrorist bombers.

She continues policy work with the Kaiser Family Fund and co-leads the Health Strategy Group for the Aspen Institute.

Sebelius earned a master's degree in public administration from the University of Kansas and a bachelor of arts from Trinity Washington University. She is married to Gary Sebelius, a retired federal magistrate judge. They have two sons and three grandsons.



Nancy DuBoc donated a magnificent set of three folios of the 1810 English translation of John Caspar Lavater's *Essays on Physiognomy, Designed to Promote the Knowledge and the Love of Mankind.* The Lavater set is shelved with the subject category of Art, because the volumes are beautifully enhanced by nearly 200 images.

Dr. Jeffrey Weidman donated seven titles in the new subject category of Humor in honor of Don Carlton. These titles include anthologies by cartoonists Gary Larson, Charles M. Schultz, Berkeley Breathed, Stephan Pastis, and, in terms of Don's specific career, Garry Trudeau's 40: A Doonesbury Retrospective.
